ILLINOIS STATE SCHOLARS

The Mater Dei Administration and College Placement Office has received notice that TWENTY EIGHT members of the Mater Dei Class of 2016 have been named Illinois State Scholars. This number represents 25% of the class (the state average is 10% of a class).

Selection for this honor is based on a combination of a student's ACT and/or SAT test score(s), GPA, and class rank at the end of his/her junior year, unless he/she scores at or above the 95th percentile in Illinois on the ACT and/or SAT test(s). While students do not receive a monetary award, they are able to list this prestigious honor on both college applications and scholarship applications.

MATER DEI CONTINUES ITS DUAL CREDIT COURSES

When registration begins for the 2016-2017 school year, Mater Dei students will again have the opportunity to enroll in a number of Kaskaskia College dual credit courses. Many students have taken advantage of this opportunity over the years. Last year students earned 1,967 hours of college credit and more than 230 students participated in the program this year. Because of the dual credit classes, students have been able to double major in college, lighten a heavy course load, or even graduate in less than four years, saving significant money in college tuition and fees. Dual credit classes being offered again next year are Accounting Principles, Advanced Computer Applications, Building Trades II, English Composition 101, English Composition 102, Chemistry II, CISCO Networking Basics, CISCO Routing and Switching, Marketing (with Small Business Management), Physics Honors, Psychology, Sociology, Speech 103, and Weightlifting & Conditioning.

A new mandate by Mater Dei's dual credit partner, Kaskaskia College, to have faculty teaching dual credit courses required to have a Master's degree in the subject matter or a Master's plus 18 graduate hours in the subject, will be instituted for the 2017-2018 school year. Mr. Litteken reports that, after being audited by Kaskaskia College concerning its dual credit courses, Mater Dei is compliant for its English, Physics, Chemistry, Psychology, Sociology, Marketing, Accounting, Computer Applications, CISCO Networking, and CISCO Routing and Switching dual credit classes and is in the process of becoming compliant for its Speech course. Compliance for the Weightlifting & Conditioning and Building Trades II classes are being discussed.

MATER DEI GRADUATES ATTEND COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES ACROSS THE UNITED STATES


Each fall our seniors are busy applying to colleges and universities. About 70% of our seniors will go to a four year school; 28% go to a two year institution. The College Placement Office processes applications to local schools such as SIUE, SIUC, Maryville University, University of Illinois, Millikin University, and Saint Louis University. Some students are willing to venture out further and they will apply to Bradley University, Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau, Murray State University, University of Evansville in Indiana, University of Kentucky, University of Alabama, and University of Iowa. Our top students have applied to top tier schools such as the Air Force Academy, the US Military Academy, the Naval Academy, Yale University, Washington University, University of Illinois-Chicago, Harvard, Notre Dame, Purdue, Duke, Tulane, Vanderbilt, Princeton, Stanford, M.I.T., and Cornell. Still others have applied to Kaskaskia College.


The College Placement Office works closely with those students who apply to Kaskaskia College and other two year institutions to ensure that they depart Mater Dei with a clear goal for their future and know to which four year school they will transfer. Students who plan to pursue a technical field, such as welding, automotive tech, radiology, nursing, and construction trades, at a two year school, are given the same attention as those students who apply to Ivy League schools. In short, Mater Dei strives to work with all students to prepare them to achieve their career goals.

MD GRADUATES ATTENDING SERVICE ACADEMIES DO MATER DEI PROUD





Midshipman Luke Foppe




Cadet Grace Chiarolanza



ACT College Readiness Benchmarks

We are also pleased to announce that the percentage of students from our Class of 2015 who achieved the college readiness benchmarks established by ACT surpassed the percentages of the state, as well as the percentages of Carlyle, Central, Centralia, Greenville, Highland, Lebanon, Mt. Vernon, O'Fallon, Salem, Triad, and Wesclin.

Through research with postsecondary institutions nationwide, ACT has determined that a minimum composite score of 21 classifies students as "Ready for College Coursework." In addition, ACT determined the following ACT College Readiness benchmarks in order to more precisely measure college readiness in each subject area: English—minimum score of 18, Math—minimum score of 22, Reading—minimum score of 22, Science—minimum score of 23.



students and Mr. Korte and his staff. The Marching Knights begin their competition season in the summer with a three-day freshman training camp followed by a two-week full band camp. It is during this camp, which takes place from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. for the two weeks, that the group's field show is learned. When the new school year starts in mid-August, Marching Knights members practice on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m. to master their field show, while members of the Drumline and Color Guard have additional practices on Mondays from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. The competition season begins in September and goes through October, requiring band members to give up their Saturdays to represent Mater Dei. Not only does the band participate in field show competitions throughout the fall, it also takes part in numerous parades, including the St. Louis Thanksgiving Day Parade which calls for an extra two weeks of practice after the field show season ends. Also, the Marching Knights were asked to perform at halftime and during the game for the two playoff home games awarded the Football Knights in their post-season run.

The Marching Knights often get overlooked during the busy fall semester, but the talented and committed students that make up the Marching Knights should be applauded for their success and trophies. They are another reason the Mater Dei Community is proud to say, "We are MD!"


September 26 – 2nd Place, Best Percussion, and Best Auxilliary at the McKendree Preview of Champions in Lebanon, Illinois.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN RETREAT

Plans are underway for the development of the 2016-2020 School Improvement Plan. This plan, the sixth in the past thirty years, allows the Mater Dei community to evaluate, to plan, and to commit to the various aspects of the Mater Dei mission for the next five years.

As the Steering Committee Chairman, Mr. Dennis Litteken, Principal, will guide the following nine committees: Catholic Identity, Curriculum, Development and Public Relations, Enrollment, Facilities, Finance, Governance, Staffing, and Student Activities. The committees will then convene for the Strategic Planning Retreat on Friday and Saturday, March 11-12, 2016.

The retreat will be facilitated by Sr. Virginia Kampwerth, PHJC, former Mater Dei faculty and administration member, who left Mater Dei when she was voted to the Poor Handmaids of Jesus Christ Provincial Leadership team in 2005.

Mr. Litteken is seeking volunteers from the Mater Dei community to help gather information through surveys, research, and group discussions, and then attend the retreat to help make school improvement recommendations.
