WHERE HAS SECOND SEMESTER GONE?

As the end of the semester quickly approaches, our teachers are challenging our students to continue to achieve academic success by putting forth an extra effort to remain focused in class, to complete all assignments, and to prepare for semester exams.

Please remind your child that these final weeks impact not only his/her quarter grades, but also his/her semester exam grades and final semester grades! In addition, please note that a student's final semester grades, which are stated on his/her high school transcript, are used to calculate his/her grade point average (GPA).

REVIEW - REVIEW - REVIEW TIPS FOR EXAM PREPARATION

- <u>Use 3 x 5 index cards</u> to organize key concepts. It is easier to refer to a stack of cards than a large textbook.
- <u>Rework (not simply reread) problems</u> from previous assignments, review sheets, quizzes, and tests.
- <u>Review on a continual basis</u> instead of studying for one extended period of time.
- Study with a buddy and quiz each other.
- <u>Request help</u> from teachers on topics which were previously difficult.
