Leisure . . . Our numerous, varied, and successful extracurricular activities and athletics allow our students to discover, to share, and to further develop their many talents and gifts.


You . . . Our exceptional commitment to serving our students and our parents results in our students' ability to achieve their fullest potential.

FAITH

LEARNING OUR FAITH Students further develop their faith through their theology classes (one per semester) and days of retreat (one per year). We also welcome students of other faith traditions (currently 14% of our student body).

LOVING OUR FAITH For Masses, students serve as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, greeters, lectors, musicians, servers, and ushers. Select seniors serve as catechists for Youth Faith Formation (YFF) and Parish School of Religion (PSR) programs.

LIVING OUR FAITH

Service: Students participate in service both as a school community and as individuals. Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors complete Works of Mercy each semester, and seniors complete a three-week Senior Service Project in January.

Class Missions and Special Causes: During the 2023-2024 school year, our Mater Dei community raised \$11,278 in support of our class missions and a variety of special causes and hosted two food collections for those in need.

Liturgical Opportunities: Students participate in Masses as a school community (once per month) and with their theology class (once per semester). In addition, optional morning prayer is offered daily and a reconciliation service is held during Lent.

ACADEMICS

CURRICULUM Our multi-level curriculum allows all students, including those needing academic accommodations, to challenge themselves and to achieve success. (Academic accommodations include those outlined in an IEP - Individual Education Plan).

Moreover, in addition to a wide range of courses in “traditional” disciplines, we offer courses in agriculture, business education, computer science, culinary arts, fine arts, industrial education, and sewing, as well as a CNA (certified nursing assistant) program.

FACULTY AND CLASS ADVISORS With small class sizes, our knowledgeable and dedicated faculty provide individual instruction, guidance, and academic accommodations (including those outlined in an IEP - Individual Education Plan). Additionally, our advisors (one per grade) monitor students’ academic success and provide guidance with course selections.

STUDY HALL Our daily schedule includes a school-wide study hall. Following ten minutes of silent reading, students may receive assistance from teachers and peer tutors, attend meetings, or complete assignments.

DIRECTOR OF COLLEGE PLACEMENT Our director of college placement assists students and parents with the college placement process, including ACT and SAT preparation, college searches and applications, scholarships, financial aid, and NCAA eligibility. We also host a college fair, ACT prep sessions, and a college planning workshop (for parents).

COLLEGE CREDIT HOURS Offered at Mater Dei for no additional fee,* our seventeen dual credit courses provide both experience with college-level coursework and future financial savings. * *Residential Electricity is offered off-campus and includes a fee.* Our Class of 2024 earned nearly 1,600 credit hours – an average of 19 credit hours per student and a total savings of at least \$900,000 (based on an average tuition cost of \$565 per credit hour).

Bring Your Own Device

For academic purposes, students may utilize the school-wide Wi-Fi and the electronic device of their choice.

Microsoft Office 365 License

Students receive a Mater Dei email account and a license to download Microsoft Office 365 products to five devices.

Electronic Learning Days

Via Microsoft Teams, teachers and students are able to interact while the teachers live stream classes. As a result, days of learning are not lost to “snow days.”

Electronic Textbooks (e-books)

The use of e-books has been implemented in numerous courses.

PlusPortals

Our interactive web portal provides students and parents with academic, attendance, and discipline reports, as well as general information.

NOTE: For theology, transfer students are only required to earn credit for each semester they are enrolled at Mater Dei.

NOTE: For science and social studies, 3.0 credits are recommended for college.

NOTE: For foreign language (Spanish), 2.0 credits are recommended for college.

TUITION AND FEES

TUITION Families choose from the following payment schedules: twelve-month, ten-month, quarterly, semi-annual, or annual. The 2024-2025 tuition rates are as follows:

Catholic Students: first student \$6,310, second student \$5,440

Non-Catholic and Out-of-District Students: first student \$6,810, second student \$6,410

Additional students enrolled during the same year are not charged tuition.

COURSE AND ACTIVITY FEE The course and activity fee (paid in August) offsets the expenses related to instructional materials, graduation, library services, retreats, technology, and standardized testing. The fee typically ranges from \$260 to \$350 depending on a student's grade level and courses.

Additional fees are **not** charged for transportation, participation in activities and athletics, parking, and admission to home athletic events, the musical, and the play.

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

OUR COMMITMENT We are committed to ensuring that **all** students receive the opportunity to attend Mater Dei, regardless of their family's financial resources.

In fact, **nearly 50%** of our students received a scholarship or memorial grant for the 2024-2025 school year.

WHO CAN APPLY All families may apply for scholarships and/or memorial grants on an annual basis.

Scholarships: We award over fifty scholarships of various amounts on the basis of each scholarship's designated qualification(s) – academic, leadership, financial need, ethnicity, grade level, and/or affiliation to a specific parish, school, or community. Additionally, specific parishes, schools, and organizations award scholarships independently of Mater Dei.

Memorial Grants: We award over \$100,000 in memorial grants of various amounts based on financial need.

HOW TO APPLY At the time of registration, families of incoming freshmen receive our general scholarship application (due May 1) and memorial grant application (due June 15). (Those who register after June 15 may still apply for a memorial grant.)

By completing our general scholarship application, a student is automatically considered for all applicable scholarships awarded by Mater Dei.

Below we address the most frequently asked questions from students and parents.

QUESTIONS FROM STUDENTS

Friends: How will I meet people? Will I make friends?

Each year our freshmen consistently report that meeting new people and making new friends are two of their favorite aspects of attending Mater Dei.

To assist our freshmen with their transition, we host multiple events that continually promote a sense of community.

- Freshman Welcome (May)
- Summer Emails (June, July, August)
- Freshman Lock-In (August, hosted by seniors and faculty)
- Freshmen-Only First Day of School

Extracurriculars: Will I be interested? Will I have time?

Our extensive variety of activities and athletics provides students with opportunities to explore, to develop, and to share their gifts and talents. There is truly something for everyone!

Therefore, we utilize two methods of ensuring students are aware of all the extracurricular opportunities:

- distribute our *Extracurricular Activities Guide*, which includes descriptions of and contacts for our activities and athletics
- host an activities fair, which allows students to sign up for activities and to receive information from current members

Finally, aside from athletics, numerous activities hold meetings during the daily school-wide study hall, which minimizes or eliminates meetings after school and allows our students to participate in multiple activities.

QUESTIONS FROM PARENTS

Transportation: To where do you provide bus service?

We provide **free** bus transportation (to and from school) for students outside the Central Community High School District:

- north to Highland
- east to Posey - Hoffman - Centralia - Sandoval - Carlyle
- west to O'Fallon * - Lebanon - New Baden -Trenton

** In O'Fallon, the location is the park 'n ride at I-64/Air Mobility Drive.*

Extracurriculars: Will living outside of Breese limit my child's participation in activities and athletics?

Aside from athletics, numerous activities hold meetings during the daily school-wide study hall, which minimizes or eliminates meetings after school. Students are also welcome to remain on campus and utilize the Lampe Commons to study, relax with peers, or prepare a snack (vending machines and microwaves are available). Finally, families often share travel obligations.

Academics: Can you meet my child's academic needs?

Our extensive, multi-level curriculum allows **all** students, including those needing academic accommodations, to enroll in the course levels that meet their needs. We do not "track" students, as we know their needs vary by academic discipline.

Students may also receive additional assistance from teachers or peer tutors during the daily school-wide study hall.

Finally, we highly value working hand-in-hand with parents for the benefit of our students.

CLASS OF 2024 ACT SCORES

We are proud to share highlights of the ACT composite scores earned by members of the Class of 2024.

ILLINOIS STATE SCHOLARS The average of the ACT composite scores for the nineteen Illinois State Scholars is 26.7.

VALEDICTORIANS The average of the ACT composite scores for the sixteen valedictorians is 26.4.

ACT COMPOSITE SCORES

- **30 or higher** The top 11% of scores (7) are all 30 or higher and have an average of 31.9
- **28 or higher** The top 21% of scores (13) are all 28 or higher and have an average of 30.1.
- **25 or higher** The top 34% of scores (21) are all 25 or higher and have an average of 28.4
- **23 or higher** The top 44% of scores (27) are all 23 or higher and have an average of 27.3.

Statistics include scores for the 61 of 82 Class of 2024 members who reported ACT composite scores. Scores for our "single-year" international students are not included in the statistics.

CLASS OF 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

FAITH The Class of 2024 included six catechists who served local Youth Faith Formation (YFF) and Parish School of Religion (PSR) programs and fifteen extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

SERVICE For four years, the Class of 2024 provided service related to the Works of Mercy and donated to Daystar Community Program in Cairo, Illinois, as their class mission. They also funded a \$1,200 Pay It Forward Scholarship for the Class of 2028.

KNOWLEDGE

Illinois State Scholars: The Class of 2024 included nineteen Illinois State Scholars (23% of the eligible members of the class).

National Merit Scholarship Program (NMSP) Commended Student: The Class of 2024 included one student who earned recognition as an NMSP Commended Student. (Approximately 50,000 students in the nation earn NMSP recognition.)

Scholarships: Fifty-three members (63%) of the Class of 2024 received scholarship offers, which totaled over \$7 million.

National Honor Society (NHS): Forty-three members (52%) of the Class of 2024 were members of NHS, having earned a GPA of 3.6 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

Academic Honors: Thirty-seven members (45%) of the Class of 2024 earned academic honors: twenty-six summa cum laude (3.9 to 4.0 GPA, blue cord), six magna cum laude (3.8 to 3.89 GPA, red cord), five cum laude (3.7 to 3.79 GPA, white cord).

College Credit Hours: Through enrollment in our dual credit courses, the Class of 2024 earned nearly 1,600 credit hours, which is an average of 19 credit hours per student.
